Pac-12 Men's Swimmer of the Year. Cordes, who was already named NCAA Swimmer of the Year, won two individual national champion-



Cordes also won a gold medal and bronze medal at the 2012 FINA World Swimming Championships in December. Cordes began swimming in Naperville at the age of seven at the Maverick Swim Club before swimming with the Fox Valley Swim Club and Neuqua Valley High School. He was also on the water polo team for three years.


